



EXISTING CONDITIONS

Existing shingle roof should be removed from existing projecting sign.

Existing wood panels and shingle canopy should be removed from building.

Window graphics should be removed from display windows, giving a the business a visual connection with the street.

NOT FOR COLOR MATCH

Second floor windows should be painted Red Bay (SW 6321) from Sherwin Williams paints.

New reverse channel-set aluminum letters in American Typewriter font should be installed to the brick wall through the mortar joints . The letters should be back-lit with red neon tubing, to silhouette the sign during day and at night.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO EXISTING SIGN



Existing projecting sign should be refurbished with new plastic panels. Light bulbs on arrow should be replaced to bring the sign back into working order.
