PROPOSED DESIGN

Scrape, prime (Sherwin Williams's KEM Kromik) and paint the sheet-metal cornice and window hoods * Remove obsolete anchors and repoint the masonry prior to repainting. Use lime-lime based mortar (type N or O) * Repair wood window bays. Replace missing or rotted wood in kind * All upper story windows should be double hung * Remove loose paint from the stone window sills. Repaint only if necessary * Scrape, prime (Sherwin Williams's Pro-Cryl) and repaint the cast iron columns and storefront lintel * Replace the south upstairs entrance with one that is more historically appropriate (like the north one). Paint both entrances * Repaint transoms * Retain and repair the operable awning mechanism. Replace the fabric with proposed * Replace broken pieces of black structural glass (www.vitrolitespecialist.com) * Replace broken mosaic tiles in the entrance (www.restorationtile.com)
