

EXISTING CONDITIONS

104 N. Market:

- Repair the wall of the formerly adjoining building. It can be a source of unwanted moisture.
- Remove all obsolete anchors and conduit. Relocate satellite dish elsewhere. Patch holes with mortar to match the existing.
- Inspect canopy and supports. Repair as necessary. Paint the support rods.
- Inspect parapet flashing. Repair as necessary.
- Retain and repaint the front door. Use a light color so it remains visible.
- Remove all existing signage.
- Reopen the covered window.
- Install an individually lettered sign as shown. Sign is mounted to the top edge of the canopy. Sign can be made of cast or cut metal.

102 N. Market:

- Remove siding covering up the upper portion of the glazed Tiffany brick. Any structural issues should be properly addressed. Possible scenarios include lintel repair and/or replacement and brick removal and reinstallation. Any spalling glaze should be flaked off and those areas painted with acrylic paint (Thorosheen).
- Install new parapet cap and flashing.
- Reopen the large historic display window opening. The window may be broken up by mullions, but the opening size should remain as shown.
- Remove all existing signs.
- Replace the front door with more historically appropriate (similar to 104 N. Market). Paint it to match the window.
- Install two separate awnings as shown.
- Apply a vinyl graphic to the window as shown.
