## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE

ILLINOIS STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE
AND THE FEDERAL HIGHWAYS ADMINISTRATION
FOR THE 59TH STREET BRIDGE AT LAKE SHORE DRIVE
CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

SUBMITTED TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION PURSUANT TO 36 CFR 800.6(a)

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WHEREAS, the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) has determined that the rehabilitation of the 59th Street at Lake Shore Drive Bridge will have an effect on this structure, which contributes to the significance of the Jackson Park-Midway Plaisance Historic District, a property listed on the National Register of Historic Places; and has consulted with the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office (ILSHPO) pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and its implementing regulations 36 CFR Part 800 "Protection of Historic Properties" and;

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the Chicago Department of Public Works, Bureau of Transportation (CDPW) participated in the consultation and have been invited to concur in this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA);

NOW, THEREFORE, FHWA and ILSHPO agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations to take into account the effect of the undertaking on this historic property.

## Stipulations

The FHwA shall ensure that the following measures are carried out:

## 1. Recordation

- A. The existing structure shall be documented in accordance with Historic American Buildings Survey/ Historic American Engineering Record (HABS/HAER) Standards before construction commences.
- B. Level 1 documentation will be required. Level 2 will be acceptable if original drawings are available. In order to ascertain requirements for compliance with this level of documentation, FHwA shall contact HAER at:

- C. The FHwA, through competitive bid, may award the recordation contract to a consultant of its choice, provided the consultant is qualified to perform the work and agrees to meet HABS/HAER Standards.
- D. This documentation must be submitted to and accepted by HABS/HAER prior to initiation of the project.

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- 2. Historic Materials Treatment
  - A. The FHwA shall, in consultation with the ILSHPO, conduct an analysis of existing historic material by a qualified person(s) to determine the extent and integrity of such material.
  - B. Historic material that retains sufficient integrity to allow feasible rehabilitation shall, in consultation with the ILSHPO, be repaired in accordance with the recommended approaches of the "Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings" (SIS).
  - C. Historic material that proves infeasible to rehabilitate shall, in consultation with the ILSHPO, be replaced in accordance with the SIS.
- 3. Design of the pedestrian railing shall be carried out in accordance with the SIS in consultation with the ILSHPO.

Execution of this MOA and carrying out its terms evidence that the FHwA has afforded the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation a reasonable opportunity to comment on this undertaking as it affects cultural resources and that the FHwA has taken into account the effects of its undertaking on this historic property.
